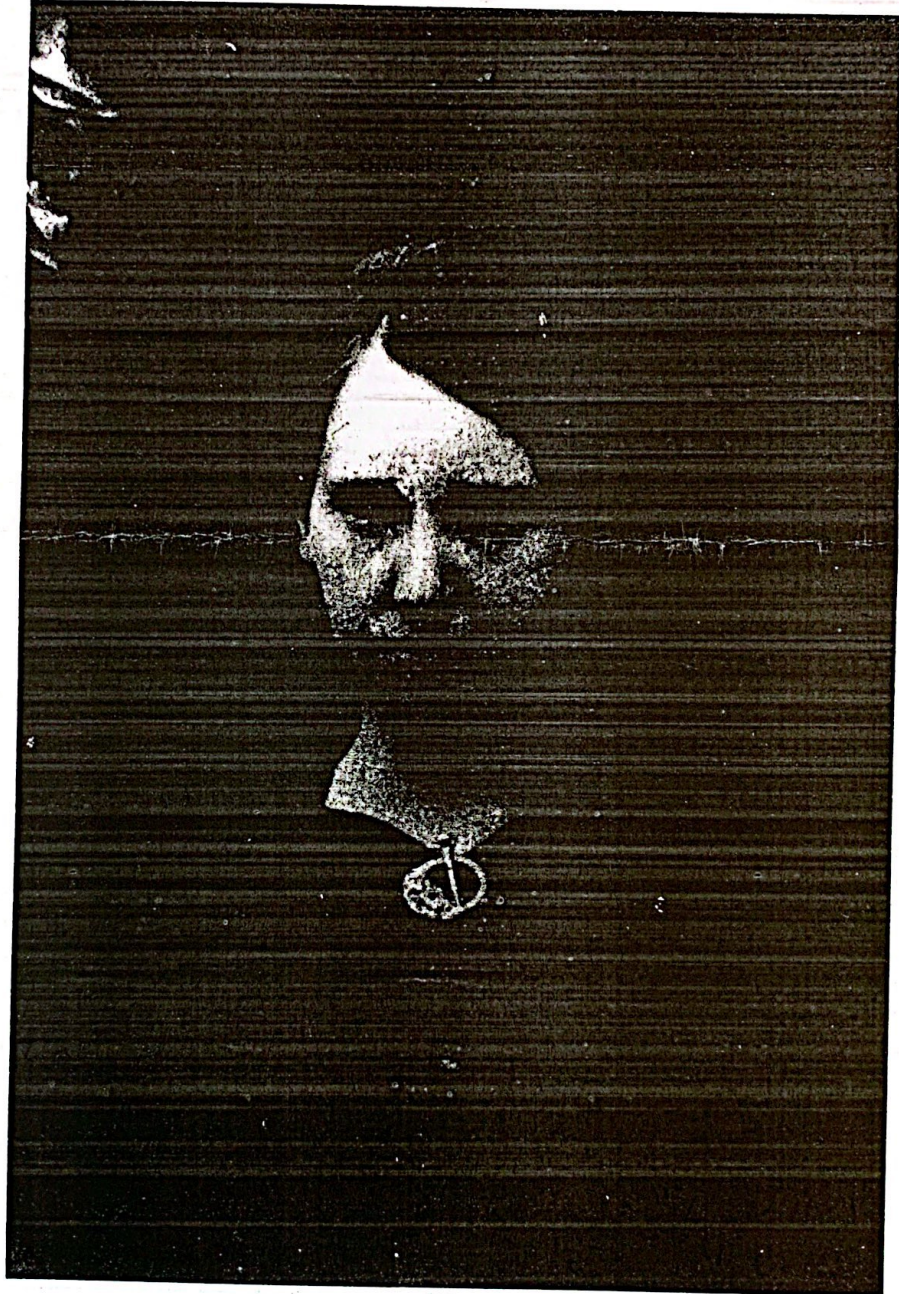

ALEXANDRA COLLEGE COUNCIL MINUTE BOOK

Friday May 17, 1918: Miss Norah Scott wrote resigning the position of Pfeiffer Lecturer for next year, owing to the state of her health. The Council decided to pay Miss Scott the full salary for the first six months of the year and to postpone the election of a successor till the June meeting.

Friday June 28, 1918: Miss Macardle was appointed for the year as deputy for the Pfeiffer Professor.

Friday June 20, 1919: A letter from Lady Principal was read for the Council by Vice-Warden with regard to the re-appointment of Miss Macardle as deputy Pfeiffer Lecturer in English Literature. After some discussion it was decided that Miss Macardle be continued in this position for another year and the Secretary was directed to communicate this decision and the conditions of continuance to Miss Macardle.

Friday December 8th, 1922: The Secretary read for the Council Miss Macardle's letter informing them that it was her intention to "undertake premeditated public political work". As No. 8 on agenda list was "arrest of Miss Macardle" the Council decided that the following letter should be sent to Miss Macardle and a copy to her father (whose letter to Miss White was also read for the Council)

"That inasmuch as Miss Macardle has been unable to perform her duties this Term, and has been absent without leave from the Council, the Council have regretfully been obliged to declare her position vacant as from the 15th of November, and will proceed to make another appointment".

Friday, March 9, 1923: (next meeting)

Miss Norah Scott was appointed Pfeiffer Professor of English Literature in the place of Miss Macardle at the same salary.
